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
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REGISTER FOR THE 2023 ALPOC ANNUAL SUMMIT

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2024-2025 OBSTETRIC AND NEONATAL QUALITY IMPROVEMENT INITIATIVES

The ALPQC staff is hard at work preparing for the rollout of the new 2024-2025 initiatives. Our quality improvement bundle for obstetrics will focus on Obstetric Hemorrhage (OBH) and will be aimed at reducing the rate of severe maternal morbidity and mortality among patients who experience an OBH.

The neonatal/pediatric initiative will be selected during our 2023 Annual Hospitals Summit. Attendees of the summit will have an opportunity to learn more about the initiative candidates and will vote on the final 2024-2025 neonatal/pediatric bundle during the breakout session.

2023 NATIONAL MATERNAL HEALTH INNOVATION SYMPOSIUM

The Maternal Health Learning and Innovation Center (MHLIC) will be hosting a virtual symposium August 9-10, 2023. The in-person event is sold out, but virtual participants can register here. The keynote speaker is Sabia Wade, CEO for The Black Doula, Inc., who will be discussing Collective Liberation as a Pathway to Equitable Perinatal Care. There will be a variety of other topics presented during the virtual event.



New Resources Available for Current ALPQC Initiatives

Thanks to your feedback during our 1-on-1 ALPQC Quality Improvement sessions. The ALPQC identified the need for resources to support the hospitals throughout the state. We have added a peer-to-peer video from Dr. Brian Brocato on our ALPQC.org website that encourages provider utilization of the evidence-based severe maternal hypertension bundle. Additionally, we have partnered with ADPH, VitAL, and JCDH to create a flyer for distribution to help prompt patient conversations with providers regarding opioid use during and after pregnancy, as well as resources regarding naloxone kits. The flyer will be distributed to hospitals via email and posted on our website.

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ALPQC PARTICIPATION HELPS HOSPITALS WITH CMS & BCBS


DESIGNATIONS

The Alabama Perinatal Quality Collaborative aims to share opportunities for education and training through collaborative cooperation, evidence-based practices, and equitable approaches to improve maternal and infant health outcomes. CMS and BCBS have recognized the role that national and statewide quality collaboratives play in improving the overall health of communities and have added participation in such collaboratives as a requirement for receiving certain designations.

As part of CMS's 2023 Inpatient Prospective Payment System (IPPS), CMS will be launching a publicly-reported "Birthing-Friendly" hospital designation in the Fall of 2023 for hospitals that participate in a national or statewide quality collaborative (such as ALPQC) and implement all recommended interventions. The designation would be displayed on the CMS websites to identify hospitals that have demonstrated a commitment to improving health outcomes for pregnant and postpartum patients.

Similarly, BCBS has created the Centers for Maternity Care Blue Distinction and Blue Distinction+ designations for hospitals that meet overall quality measures for patient safety and outcomes. Hospitals that receive these designations can be accessed by the public on the BCBS website.

By participating in the ALPQC, hospitals become part of a supportive community of collaborating hospitals - all working towards improving perinatal outcomes in Alabama. Our evidence-based initiatives have been developed by the Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health (AIM), as well as a nationwide network maternal and neonatal quality collaboratives.
